KEITH CHARTERS

Keith Charters is a British author and publisher. Born in Edinburgh in 1965, he grew up in Glasgow where he attended the University of Strathclyde. His first novel for children, *Lee and the Consul Mutants* was published in 2004 and his second, *Lee Goes For Gold*, in 2006. Those two books claimed the #1 and #4 slots respectively in the Children's Best Sellers list published by The Herald. Two more books in the Lee series were similarly well received. In 2006 Keith established Strident Publishing Company in Scotland, to promote and publish new books for children.



MARIE-LOUISE FITZPATRICK

Author and illustrator Marie-Louise Fitzpatrick won the 20th Bisto Children's Book of the Year 2010 for her book *There*. She also won the Bisto Honour Award for Illustration. Fitzpatrick has previously won the award twice, in 2001 and 2003, for her books *You, Me and the Big Blue Sea* and *Izzy and Skunk*, and has also been a nominee for The Hans Christian Andersen Award.



RENATE AHRENS

Renate Ahrens, born in Herford, Germany, in 1955, studied English and French literature at the universities of Marburg, Lille and Hamburg. She worked as a teacher for a few years, before she and her husband moved to Dublin in 1986. Since then she has been a freelance writer. She publishes in German and English, at first mainly texts for German children's radio, scripts for children's television, and a radio play for Irish radio (RTE). In 1998 her first stage play was produced in Dublin, and her first children's book was published in Germany. Many more followed, including *Over The Wall*.



NIALL DE BURCA

Niall de Burca was raised in Galway. He is one of Ireland's finest bilingual traditional storytellers, featuring in theatre, radio, television and at festivals throughout the country. His tales of giants, goblins, elves and fairies will keep you at the edge of your seat. Using his voice with the skill of a true craftsman, de Burca makes the characters in his stories come alive for children, teenagers and adults alike.



KATHLEEN O'SULLIVAN AND BILLY TEARE

Billy incorporates many talents such as music, juggling, mimicry and superb memory skills in his storytelling performances. With hundreds of appearances at high profile festivals and venues, Billy and Kathleen are internationally acclaimed folk artists. They offer an entertaining and educational presentation of Storytelling, Song, Music, Poetry and Arts and Crafts. Billy and Kathleen can adapt their work for any age and ability.



RÉ O LAIGHLÉIS

Sallynoggin-born Ré O' Laighléis was a primary school teacher in Galway for 12 years before he packed in the day job to concentrate on writing full time. His progress into writing books was entirely accidental but also very significant from the point of view of those who set the Leaving Certificate Irish syllabus. The introduction of GAFA into the secondary school curriculum has been roundly welcomed on the grounds that Irish as a school subject has finally got a dose of reality and is in step with a contemporary beat at last. Ré can entertain children and teenagers in both Irish and English. He is also involved in publishing children's, teenage and adult fiction in Irish and English through Moinín Publishing, Ballyvaughan, Co.Clare.

This year the Festival's hero is Hans Christian Andersen, one of the world's greatest storytellers. The month long festival will be launched on Friday 1 October by Niall de Burca who will reawaken the magic of Andersen's fairy tales. The prize of the trip to wonderful, wonderful Copenhagen, where Hans Christian Andersen lived, will also be presented to the child who has succeeded in reading 44 books or more over the summer months in our *Stick With Reading* challenge!

This year's Bisto award winner and former Hans Christian Andersen Award nominee, Marie Louise Fitzpatrick, will visit later in the festival schedule. Also, Sophie Carton will help children to bring their fairy tales to life with clay workshops.

The Goethe Institute invite author of *Over the Wall*, Renate Ahrens, to talk about experiences in Hamburg after the fall of the Berlin Wall. Author Keith Charters will get reluctant readers reading and the irrepressible Ré O Laighléis will encourage children to read Irish books.

The Irish Dogs Trust will visit all libraries and talk about the importance of caring properly for your dog.

The Blackrock Observatory *Cooks Up A Comet!* and will allow children to experience the magic of the stars in their *StarDome*, all as part of World Space Week 2010.

Oceans of Notions will perform *Ashputtel and Other Tales* and Seán O Laoghaire will keep children entertained with his stories and puppets.

Poet Alan Murphy drops in to read from his book *The Mona Lisa's On Our Fridge* while another poet, Paul Tubb, will bring poetry to places where no poet has gone before!

We have other events too: Storytelling, Halloween colouring, Yu-Gi-Oh & much more.

So there's lots to look forward to in the 2010 Children's Book Festival, where everyone's a beautiful swan & there are no ugly ducklings!

Hans Christian Andersen

April 2, 1805 – August 4, 1875

Hans Christian Andersen was a Danish author and poet noted for his children's stories. During his lifetime he was acclaimed for having delighted children worldwide, and was feted by royalty. His poetry and stories have been translated into more than 150 languages.

They have inspired motion pictures, plays, ballets, and animated films.

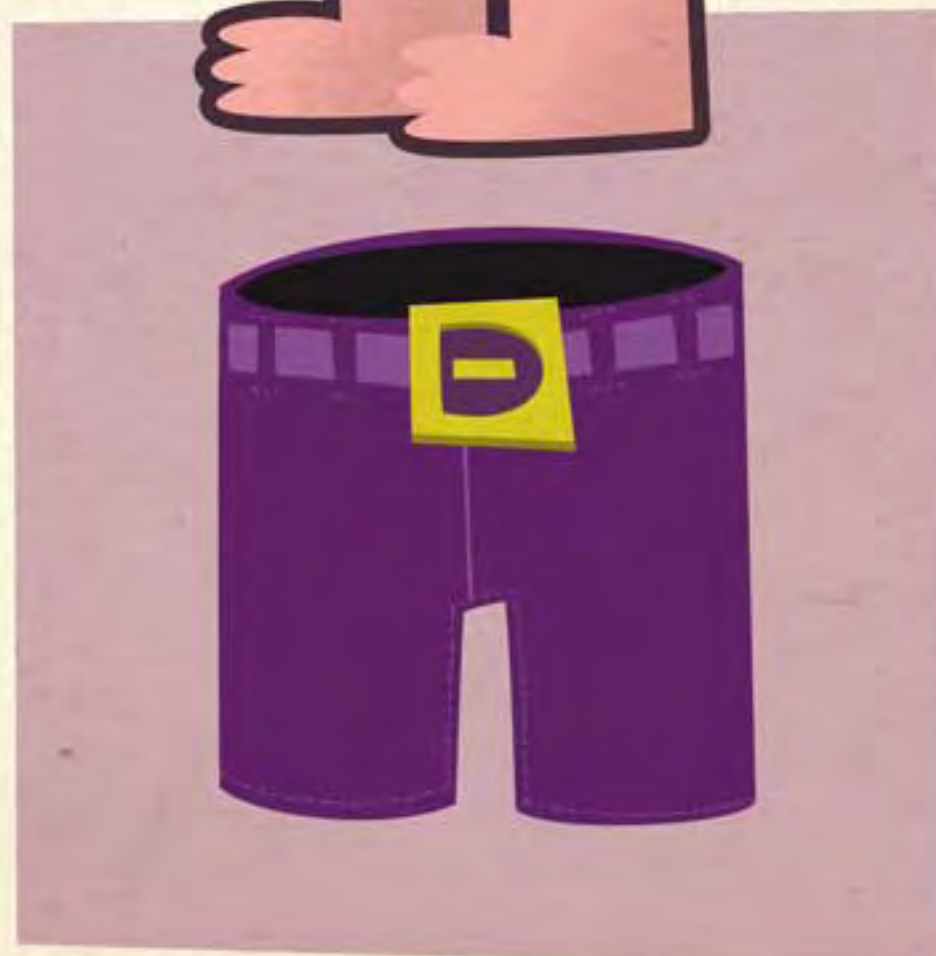

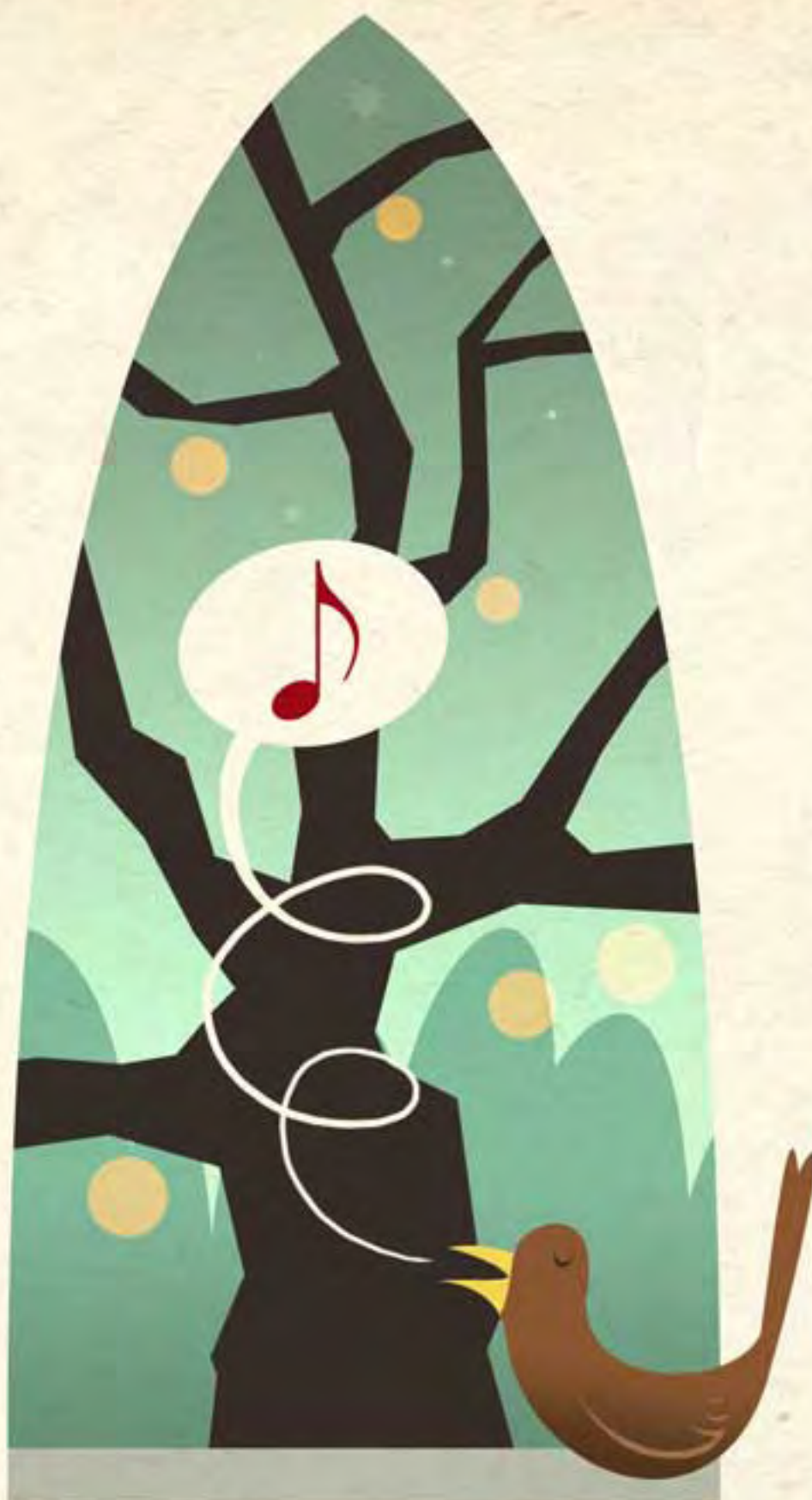

PAUL TUBB

English-born, Dublin-based poet Paul H. Tubb was born in 1973 and intended to do nothing for the entirety of his life. After about 30 years, he discovered that he had accidentally written some strange poetry and songs which were suitable for children. Paul's first collection of poetry for children is out now, published by Trafford and entitled *Please Do Not Encourage This Nonsense by Purchasing This Book*. The book contains 23 Poems Not About Football, 11 That Are About Football and 5 limericks. The poems are about subjects such as strange Christmases, tone deaf dentists and the world's worst stuntman, among others.



ALAN MURPHY

Author and poet Alan Murphy hails from Dublin, but is now living in Lismore. He possesses a diploma in Fine Art and has exhibited his paintings and collages in Dublin, Waterford, Sligo and Belfast. He has published a handful of "serious" poems to date, mostly in English journals. His book *The Mona Lisa's On Our Fridge* was reviewed in the Irish Times as one of the best children's poetry books of 2009.



DR. FRED FREEMAN

Dr. Fred Freeman, Hon. Fellow in English at the University of Edinburgh, began to re-assess the achievement of Scottish poet Robbie Burns in the 1970s, in the course of his Doctoral Thesis. He found that not only was Burns primarily a song-writer, but that justice had never been done to his songs. Freeman himself has an extensive musical background. Starting at the age of 4, he has played piano, then classical and jazz trumpet, rock bass and highland bagpipes, before concentrating fully on musical arranging and producing. He brings the magic of Robbie Burns songs and poetry to children through singing, rhythm, questioning and listening.



SEÁN O LAOGHAIRE

Get an insight into the wonderful, wacky world of Seán O Laoghaire through his puppet show and storytelling performances. Be enthralled by Fox and Vixen, Cockie and Hen, Badger and Squirrel, and their adventures in Nature's garden! Sean has grown up in a house full of stories, magic and tradition. He has written and performed puppet shows and run storytelling workshops, nationally and internationally, for many years now.



ARRAN TOWERS

Arran is co-manager, performer & tutor with Cork Circus, and over the last few years has founded the puppet theatre *Tangle Theatre*, as well as *Puppet Power* which is an arts outreach project. In addition, he is also a freelance puppeteer and visits many places with his Indian puppet show *Lungi the Travelling Puppeteer*. Arran is one of the founding members of Circus Festival Ireland.

The Ocean of Notions Theatre Company is a drama school and production company, dedicated to creating excellence in experience for all who attend their performances. StarDome planetarium programs have primarily been developed to inspire an appreciation and wonder of the night sky and to create a fun, memorable learning experience for all audiences. It is also worth noting, our school programs have been designed to support curriculum objectives found in science, social studies and language arts.

Cook up a Comet! What is a comet? What is the most famous comet of all? When will it return? What might happen if a comet was heading straight for the Earth? Use science to make a model comet to explain how comet tails behave.
